"Peaceful" Britain, murderer and enslaver of hundreds of millions of British Indians, Africans, Asiatics, and Europeans, attempts to get its European house in order in a new attempt to plunder the vast Asiatic Markets, to keep its old Empire under her. REVOLUTION STOPPED WAR IN 1918

## Shall Workers Support A Labor Party ?

With capitalist decay reaching new left, to conform to the needs of the work heights, sixteen million again unemployed, war preperations more intense and costly han ever before, a new "beacon light" s being held forth for the American workg class - the Labor Party

Shall workers help organize such a Par? Shall they support it once it is built? In the answer to these two questions are involved our basic policies in the struggle against imperialist war, and against cap. talist oppression in general.

## WHAT IS A LABOR PARTY?

What kind of a Party is this Labor Pary? Is it a workers' Party, a capitalist party, or what? In the sense that the Labor Party is based on the trade union movement, it is in form a "Workers" Party. In the broader and decisive sense, howits policies and class content, it Its PROGRAM is REFORMIST, in other words a program aiming not at the overthrow but at the reform and persetuation of capitalism. In that sense the Labor Party is a capitalist party, a reformist party.

This fact is all-important. A Labor Parin procram and in action, no matter what its composition, is and can be noth ing but another capitalist party. Mr. Browder - the Stalinist leader - four years ago spoke of a Labor Party which was "not reformist and yet not revolutionary." The Trotskyites today are advocating a Labor Party which will have "not a reformist program, but a progam of revolutionary transitional demands" (sic), in other words a Marxian program for the pre-revolutionary period. Mr. Browder subsequently came out of this coma and now recognizes that his Labor Party is to be a reformist Party. The Trotskyite rank and file, part of which is now in revolt against the leadership, may do well to

UNITY ON A "MINIMUM" PROGRAM The Labor Party is the American counerpart of the People's Front. In content although slightly different in form, the Labor Party is similar to the traditional European Parties of social democracy. Can a Labor Party be anything else? For in the Labor Party are Socialists, Stalinists, bourgeois reformists and labor fakers like Lewis, Dubinsky Hillman, Martin, Olsen (before he died) and a left cover of Lovestoneites and
Trotskyists. What is the "minimum" program that such people can be united on? It can only be a program of capitulation to reformism. It can only be a program for immediate demands within the framework of capitalism. It can only be a legislative program of class-collaboration which can not even gain any lasting immediate gains for the proletariat, let alone its final emancipation from capitalism. Any attempt to push that program to the
ing class, must result in the disintegration of that precious "unity" which is the big propaganda point for such a "Labor Par

UNITY ON A CAPITALIST PROGRAM
What do the Labor Party advocates tell he working class? They pander to the healthy desire of the working class for unity, but they create in reality not a unity of the working class but an ideological unity with the capitalist class - class collaboration. Unity with the capitalist is a split of the workers ranks. The Labor Party in reality splits the united class front of the working class.

What is the sense fighting each other Let us, the whole working class unite, and fight fascism, fight the bosses." That is the argument for the Labor Party.

But what good is such a unity if it is not on a scientific working class program, a Marxian program? The only solution for the problems of humanity lies in the proletarian revolution. Any other "solution", any "unity" on the basis of trying to patch up the capitalist system only disarms the working class, perpares it for a complete rout at the hands of fascism. An army marching unitedly in the wrong di rection is doomed to defeat.

## LABOR PARTIES ELSEWHERE

This has been proven in life. There are dozens of examples of the objective aid which Labor Parties - reformism - has given to fascism.

The classic example is Germany, where he social-democratic party - based on the trade union movement and with program even to the "left" of the Labor Party movement in the United States - murdered thousands of workers in one revolution after another and finally paved the way for fascism.

Austrian social-democracy played a sim ilar role. The British Labor Party has helped tie the workers hand and foot to the capitalist state; betrayed the genera trike of 1926 ; helped enslave the millions of colonial people of the British empire; participated in the capitalist government and helped pass compulsory artbitration aws and other strike-breaking measures, How about the Labor Parties in the United States? The Farmer-Labor Party movement in Minnesota, for example, or the American Labor Party? The former has helped murder striking workers in Minneapolis; the latter put into office and supports a strike-breaking Mayor in N. Y a strike breaking governor and a strike breaking president.

COMPANY UNION
The Kemba union is supported by Krogers and is short and simple a company union despite any advertised statements to the
contrary. Its membership is there under open compulsion, contained in a printed and circulated document that membership is a nec cessary condition for employment. Yet the membership is never called to meetings or per
mitted to call meetings of their own. They are never consulted on policy nor asked to take more insurance, just arbitrarily ordered to do so. Just to illustrate the Kroger's, the national head-quarters of the company union is located in the National Offices
